## Payment Reductions Jeopardize Access to Care for Patients

An Audiologist's and SLP's ability to provide consistent access to care for their patients and maintain their business is threatened by payment reductions from all payer sources (e.g., Medicare, Medicaid, Private Payers).

## **ACTION NEEDED**

Payment cuts are imposed across payers and take a variety of forms.

Of the nearly 4,000 survey respondents...

**52**% experienced Medicare Reductions

37.6% experienced Medicaid Reductions

48% experienced Private Insurer Reductions

**52.7**% experienced Prior Authorization Denial

29.4% experienced Post-Payment Review Denial

Survey respondents shared that they increased their fee schedule rates to maintain viability, which has an increased detrimental impact on uninsured patients or those paying out of pocket.
